

Now Pippa Middleton's derriere gets its own series

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It seems there is no looking back for Pippa Middleton and her celebrated derriere.

Artist and satirical photographer Alison Jackson is planning a series of YouTube-style episodes dedicated to achieving a bottom as perfectly sculpted as Pippa's.

Jackson, 41, who rose to fame with grainy images of a Princess Diana lookalike, tells me that after strenuous auditions she has discovered a perfect double of the acclaimed rear that almost stole the show at the Royal Wedding.

'I have created a weekly series for my website, www.alisonjackson.com, called How To Create The Perfect Pippa Bottom,' says Jackson, who won a BAFTA for her BBC2 series Doubletake.

'I held auditions for a Pippa Middleton face and a separate Pippa bottom. It took several casting sessions to find the ideal bottom double, Gabriella Parris.

'We will be putting her bottom through various exercises - pilates, squats and leg raises, to show the world how to achieve a Pippa-perfect posterior.'

Jackson, who in April released a teasing folio of photographs entitled *Kate And Wills Up The Aisle: A Right Royal Fairy Tale*, made headlines once again last week after publishing lookalike photos of Ashley Cole and his former wife Cheryl in risqué trysts.

Meanwhile, as I revealed last week, the Duchess of Cambridge's younger sister has graced the cover of *Tatler*, just five months after Kate.
