

## A right royal knees up! 'Home video' shows William flirting with Kate and Charles asking for a king-size helping at the Queen's 90th birthday party - but is it all that it seems?

The nation probably imagines the **Queen's 90th birthday** being a staid affair with polite talk, silent staff and dainty cakes and tea.

But according to footage from a 'home video' the monarch's celebrations - held very much behind closed doors - were a much more raucous affair with **William** trying to peek up **Kate's** skirt, Charles asking for a king size portion of dinner and the Queen thrilled to receive a framed photo of one of her beloved corgis.

However look closely, and it's clear this majestic knees up is all the work of BAFTA award-winning artist Alison Jackson, to show how the family might be celebrating this landmark occasion.



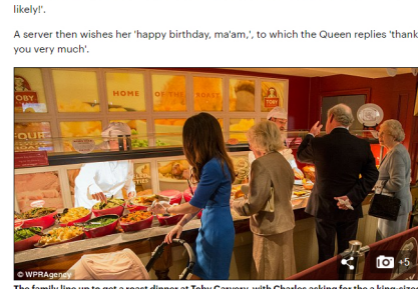
The fake video doesn't feature the real royal family, but that doesn't make it any less entertaining when they sing her happy birthday and watch the 'queen' blow out her candles

Shot from William's perspective, the candid clip shows the royal family start the nation's reigning monarch 90th birthday celebration a day early with help from a traditional British roast dinner at a Toby Carvery.

Kate is seen carrying presents to a dinner table while William films her from behind, sneakily saying 'Kate, this is a family video' as the camera tries to peer up her skirt. She swats him away and giggles as she blows up balloons to decorate.

Prince Charles and Camilla enter and greet William with a cheery wave before the birthday girl herself appears, greeting William and then queuing up to be served her birthday lunch.

Charles asks the servers for a king size portion - to which Her Majesty replies 'not likely!'.  
A server then wishes her 'happy birthday, ma'am,' to which the Queen replies 'thank you very much'.

The family are shown sitting at the table Kate decorated enjoying their plates of food, toasting the Queen's birthday with a 'hip hip hooray!' all round. Camilla particularly is enjoying a drink or two.

Cheeky Harry steals a roast potato from his grandmother's plate while Kate entertains her children by waving a toy at a pram.

As the birthday cake arrives - a chocolate confection covered in hundreds and thousands - the royal family cheer and she blows out her candles and opens her presents.



After the birthday cake, the Queen opens presents. Camilla plays on her love of dogs by presenting her with a photo frame featuring two corgis and a Union flag cushion

Camilla's canine themed gifts of a framed photo of two of her dogs and a Union flag cushion emblazoned with a crown-wearing corgi are received with pleasure, as the Queen proclaims the gifts 'so lovely'.
